The recent Food Drive, in support of the Salvation Army Food Bank in Dundas and organized by Dundas Community Services, was an over-whelming success with more than 38.6 tonnes of food and toiletries collected and over \$3,500 donated. Congratulations and thanks to the Co-Chairs, Robert Turner and Rev. Dr. Don Donaghey and the 200+ volunteers who made the endeavor such a success.

During Centennial Year 1967, Welcome to Dundas signs were installed on Cootes Dr, just east of East St and on Osler Dr, just east of Grant Blvd in the Binkley Hollow. Over time, their condition had deteriorated to the point of no return so replacement was necessary. I discussed various options with the City's Public Works Dept and through the generosity of both the Downtown Dundas BIA and the Dundas Division of the Hamilton Chamber of Commerce, new signs were designed, constructed and installed.

The City of Hamilton's Flu Clinics will commence on Nov 4th and run through Dec 10th (21 clinics in total).
